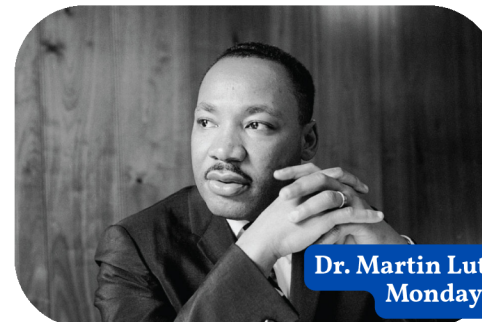


New USCCB Pastor Letter Against Racism--Jan 13 2026

"In our pastoral letter against racism, we bishops
affirm Dr. King's leadership in bringing together
people of faith in the work of racial justice, noting
'that spirit is integral to the fight today.' As we
remember Dr. King and commemorate his legacy, let
us continue this work as 'drum majors' and engage
in actions of compassion and mercy.

**"For there is no place for racism in the hearts of
any person; it is a perversion of the Lord's will for
men and women, all of whom were made in God's
image and likeness. We end by adopting the
words of St. Paul: Brothers and sisters, "be on your
guard, stand firm in the faith, be courageous, be
strong. Your every act should be done with love" (1
Cor 16:13-14)."**
