Blessed Easter once again to you all! Very grateful for your prayerful accompaniment through the Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Many thanks to all who have helped prepare our beautiful liturgies—may our hearts now and always be ‘overcome with Easter joy’ as the Mass prays for the next 50 or so days... The Second Sunday of Easter is fondly known as Sunday of Divine Mercy. Certainly we can recall the devotion to and chaplet of Divine Mercy that Jesus gave us through St. Faustina, but we also see before our eyes today that Divine Mercy—or God being deeply merciful— is not just an attribute that belongs to God, but really is the very nature of God, the essence of God. Consider the moment that Jesus first appears to the apostles...the last interaction prior that Jesus would have had was a moment where the apostles scattered in fear. They abandoned Jesus in his greatest moment of need. While easily we could expect that when once he returns victorious, vengeance would be sought. Not so with Jesus. His very first words to them are “Peace.”

Peace, however, in this context is not simply an absence of conflict, but rather it stems from the breath of Jesus’ life. If we desire to be transformed by true peace that isn’t fleeting, it must come to us through Jesus, through the gift of the Holy Spirit.. Jesus is not competing with us, nor is he trying to hide or withhold the gift of his life, his peace, his mercy—he makes these readily available to whoever sincerely seeks them in the Sacraments. As we see with Thomas today, transformative encounters with mercy produce faith and trust. There actually is no scriptural detail that says Thomas did touch the wounds of Christ...it could very well be that just by Jesus’ patience with him could be enough evidence of mercy to heal, and Jesus’ willingness to invite Thomas to touch his wounds was enough. He might not have needed anything more than that. Remember, too, from the vivid passion narrative...the side of Jesus being pierced, and pouring forth ‘blood and water’ from his heart. This image of blood and water flowing would have immediately evoked the image of what regularly would happen in the Jerusalem temple. With all the animal sacrifices, the side of the temple would pour forth blood and water as it was cleaned after the offerings. It was seen as a river of mercy flowing down through the street into the larger body of water. We know that Jesus himself was the embodiment of the Temple, that with the destruction of his body, in three days it would be raised up. If from Jesus’ side blood and water poured forth in mercy like the fulfillment of the temple, how amazing is it to think that where Jesus calls forward the touch of faith for Thomas to come to believe is in the very place and source where the river of mercy now sacramentally pours forth—Jesus’ pierced and now resurrected side!

Now we should consider our call to live as instruments of this divine mercy, and as members of His body, the Church, are reminded that the Church is born from Jesus’ side on the cross—not unlike how Eve was created from the rib or side of Adam. We are created for a deep intimacy and oneness with the Lord, and this comes to fulfillment and to be embodied in us the more and more that we choose to respond to the Lord’s mercy and live in the refuge of his most sacred heart. Consider his words to St. Faustina, and ask, what would happen in my life if I became an instrument of Jesus’ mercy? What would change? How might my presence among my friends and family take on a new level of love? Just a sampling of Jesus’ words to Faustina (below)...how amazing his mercy! Let’s not take it for granted, but entrust ourselves humbly to it!

- “Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My Mercy.”
- “My daughter [Faustina], write that the greater the misery of a soul, the greater its right to My mercy; [urge] all souls to trust in the unfathomable abyss of My mercy, because I want to save them all...The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy. My mercy is confirmed in every work of My hands. He who trusts in My mercy will not perish, for all his affairs are Mine, and his enemies will be shattered at the base of My footstool.”
- “Tell [all people], My daughter, that I am Love and Mercy itself. When a soul approaches Me with trust, I fill it with such an abundance of graces that it cannot contain them within itself, but radiates them to other souls.”
