The Lord is near to all who call upon him.

The Lord is near to all who call upon Him! (Psalm 145)...a deep consolation that we should be reminded of daily. It's worth keeping Psalm 145 (in its fullness/all verses) visibly in front of us somewhere, whether it's on the fridge, in your room getting ready for the day, wherever you will see it regularly. It boldly reminds us of the fidelity of the Lord, and the generosity with which he extends his care and mercy toward us. Again, in our readings this Sunday we are given a familiar parable, one that compares the Kingdom of Heaven to the landowner who is radically generous, irrationally so by our standards. But this seems to be quite consistent with the message that we receive from the Prophet Isaiah in our first reading about God himself: "...my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts".

Let's pause for a second and piece together some of the themes we've encountered in recent Sundays since we have an important progression through Matthew's Gospel. Last Sunday: Lord must I forgive my brother or sister? How many times?? The Sunday before: Lord, how am I supposed to handle conflict with my brother or sister? The Sunday before that: Jesus boldly stated the prediction of his Passion and death, his anticipated rejection by all and that all disciples called to follow after him will need to take up the cross, too?

With these in mind, consider the height of imitation of God that we are constantly being invited to? If we are called to share in the life of Christ this radically, then there will inevitably be the participation that looks like a familiar line from the Gospel of John: unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit (cf. John 12). While on the surface we might be deterred because of the difficulty or apparent suffering at stake, we should be comforted or assured that the Lord accompanies us through such times to bring us to the fullness of life, in ways that we could never imagine. We should probably anticipate that this journey won't look like what we expect it to—and this is a good thing. Because as the Lord said through Isaiah so high above your ways are my ways.

And maybe taking our lead from Jesus' parable...it doesn't matter what time of day (or what time or phase in our life, wherever we are, etc.) that we enter into the Lord's vineyard to labor for him...the Lord desires all to receive eternal reward. What would make someone stay in the marketplace all day waiting to be hired? Why not give up and go home? They likely remain because the human heart can only be fulfilled by serving someone beyond the self. At the end of the day, these laborers will not be able to accomplish much in terms of productive work. But they can, however, give the landowner what he most desires: an assent to his invitation. For us, this must also be true. When it comes to the end of our lives, we are quick to sum up things that we have done or accomplished, but something deeper in importance should draw our attention based on this parable. God is most interested in generously gifting his grace (or his own life) to all those who respond. All we have and all we are comes from the Lord, and humbly recognizing this cannot help but grow authentic gratitude in us. The reward of eternal life is not something quantifiable, it's not simply a payment for a life of virtue, the reward is God himself, he created us for eternal communion with himself, and we should desire all to come to know this and to courageously respond to this incredible gift and relationship, because not only will we then be drawn by and anchored toward heaven, but even now we will come to know the indescribable joy that comes from being transformed by divine life. Nothing can compare to this gift, and once we have discovered it, 'laboring' for Him is no longer a 'job,' but rather his call for us becomes our source of life.



"Acompañar 13205"

"Acompañar 13205 is a relationship-based discipleship initiative that brings together Bishop Ludden-Grimes students and parishioners from St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Syracuse. Through meaningful relationships, participants will serve the 13205 community by engaging in hands-on service projects, sharing in the richness of culture, growing together in faith, and reflecting on their experiences. Guided by the Holy Spirit, Acompañar seeks to foster authentic connections, inspire lifelong discipleship, and strengthen the bonds between generations, cultures, and the local community."

"Acompañar 13205 es una iniciativa de discipulado basada en relaciones que reúne a estudiantes de la Escuela Secundaria Bishop Ludden-Grimes y feligreses de la Parroquia San Antonio de Padua en Siracusa. A través de un acompañamiento significativo, los participantes servirán a la comunidad de 13205 participando en proyectos de servicio práctico, compartiendo la riqueza de la cultura, creciendo juntos en la fe y reflexionando sobre sus experiencias. Guiado por el Espíritu Santo, Acompañar busca fomentar conexiones auténticas, inspirar el discipulado de toda la vida y fortalecer los lazos entre las generaciones, las culturas y la comunidad local"

¿Te gustaría estar al servicio de algunos valientes estudiantes de secundaria?

Estamos buscando 20-30 adultos que estén dispuestos a unirse a un simple compromiso mensual (después de la Misa en Español) que sucederá durante todo el año escolar. Un número similar de estudiantes de nuestra escuela secundaria católica local, Bishop Ludden-Grimes, vendrán a visitarnos y juntos los voluntarios adultos y los estudiantes de secundaria se reunirán para compartir juntos el viaje de fe, pero también se unirán para hacer varios proyectos de servicio para nuestra comunidad y más allá. Los voluntarios adultos interesados necesitarán haber completado el entrenamiento de Ambiente Seguro a través de la diócesis.

We are looking for 20-30 adults who are willing to join in a simple monthly commitment that will happen throughout the school year (After the Mass in Spanish). A similar number of students from our local Catholic high school, Bishop Ludden-Grimes, will come to visit us and together adult volunteers and high school students will come together to share the faith journey together, but they will also come together to do various service projects for our community and beyond. Interested adult volunteers will need to have completed Safe Environment training across the diocese.

Las metas de este año de servicio son las siguientes:

- Juntos el Adulto y el Estudiante Participante crecerán en la fe y en la virtud.
- Juntos a través de la conversación y la construcción de relaciones, los participantes se conectarán a través de generaciones y posiblemente incluso a través de idiomas.
- Los participantes serán una bendición mutua entre sí y unidos también para varios proyectos, los servicios bendecirán a nuestra comunidad local de Syracuse.
- Ofrecer oportunidades para que los estudiantes experimenten la misa en español, así como la oportunidad de utilizar su aprendizaje en español en un contexto fuera del aula

Goals of this year of service are as follows:

- Together the Adult and the Student participants will grow in faith and in virtue.
- Together through conversation and relationship building, participants will connect across generations and possibly even across languages.
- Participants will be a mutual blessing to each other and united too for various projects, the services will bless our local Syracuse Community.
- Give opportunities for students to experience Mass in Spanish, as well as giving them an opportunity to use their Spanish learning in a context outside of the classroom
